

Investment Objective

The US Stars Equity fund seeks to generate long term capital growth by investing in a concentrated portfolio of American companies with enduring competitive advantages and a long runway of growth.

We select companies based on our own fundamental research, taking a long-term investment horizon. We do not follow benchmarks and always invest in quality.

Quality for a company means strong competitive positions, operating in good and growing industries, the financial strength to weather adversity and strong management teams with track records of value creation.

We seek to identify undervalued quality growth companies where the scale or persistence of growth is underappreciated by the market and there is the prospect of significant capital growth.

Portfolio Comment

It was a volatile month in the wider market as concerns about AI-driven disruption intensified. In particular, advancements in Anthropic's Claude model heightened fears that AI could replicate a wide range of business models with many subsectors falling sharply. Against this backdrop, the US Stars portfolio underperformed, declining -3.5% compared to the market's -0.8% return. This brought our year-to-date performance to -1.4%.


Amongst the weakest performers were technology companies perceived to be most exposed to AI disruption. These included Booking Holdings, the online travel platform, and Salesforce. Mega-cap technology companies were also softer during the period, including Amazon, Meta, and Alphabet, as the market questioned their elevated capital expenditure plans.

The strongest performer was McDonald's, reflecting a preference for businesses with tangible assets, strong brand recognition and more predictable demand in periods of heightened uncertainty.


There was modest portfolio activity during the month. We exited our position in Gartner following disappointing results. We believe that a recovery from the current slowdown in new business activity will be quite protracted. Conversely, we added to our positions in Booking Holdings, Salesforce, and Cadence, as we believe the recent weakness driven by AI disruption concerns does not reflect the underlying resilience and long-term growth prospects of these businesses.

We remain confident that our portfolio of high-quality companies with strong structural growth characteristics is well positioned to deliver attractive long-term returns. While we accept that periods of short-term volatility can disproportionately impact concentrated portfolios, we believe maintaining a long-term perspective remains the most effective way to compound value for investors.


GICS Sector Allocation
